<b>Traineeship Award (VET Award)</b> (proudly sponsored by KIC)	This award recognizes the top VET student in a School Based Traineeship. Criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>demonstrated enthusiasm and commitment to a school-based traineeship</li> <li>undertaken over 18 months</li> <li>extremely reliable and diligent in completing all the training requirements rarely missed a required day of work placement</li> </ul>
<b>Award for Excellence in VET</b> (proudly sponsored by AustralianSuper Westscheme Division)	The Australian Super Westscheme Division Award for Excellence in Vocational Education and Training acknowledges the achievements one of the top VET students at <b>Baldivis SC</b> .  <b>Criteria:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cert I or higher, 2 units of ADWPL Year 12, satisfied the requirements for WACE.</li> <li>Work reference highly supportive</li> <li>Other criteria to be communicated on an annual basis.</li> </ul>
<b>VET WPL Award</b>	Recognises the top VET student in the workplace – for a student who has shown outstanding commitment to the Workplace Learning Program and has consistently demonstrated a range of excellent employability skills. <b>Criteria:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>punctual, reliable, and respected by their peers and work colleagues at the workplace</li> <li>completed over and above the required hours in the program</li> <li>completed all the requirements in their courses at school.</li> </ul>
<b>VET Manager’s Profile Award</b>	Recognises a student who most successfully completes a certificate course at TAFE in addition to a full school timetable <b>Criteria:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>demonstrated responsibility, reliability and a positive attitude to both their school courses and TAFE.</li> </ul>
<b>Course Awards - multiple</b>	The Top Student Course Award is presented to the student who achieves the highest academic result in a course of study. <b>Criteria:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Student who achieve the top grade and mark in <u>each course</u>.</li> <li>Must achieve a minimum ‘B’ Grade in both semesters OR</li> <li>Must be in the top 15% of students in state course enrolments, if less than 6 students are enrolled at BSC</li> </ul>

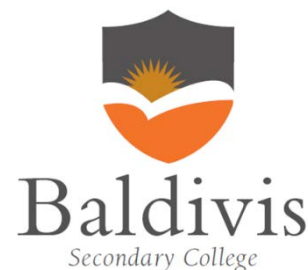
	<p>The Top Student Certificate Award is presented to the student who achieves the highest demonstrated approach and results in a Certificate.</p> <p><b>Criteria:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Student must be on Advanced Standing for Academics, Commitment and Behaviour</li> <li>• Student must be judged by the Certificate teacher to be a quality candidate in demonstrated achievement</li> </ul>
<b>General Exhibition Awards - multiple</b>	<p><b>Criteria:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minimum of 5 'A' grades in Year 12 Units (Units 3 or 4) in either ATAR or General programs, of which a minimum of 4 'A' grades must be achieved in Semester 2</li> <li>• no Unit grades less than a 'B' for each of the recipients.</li> </ul>
<b>VET Dux</b>	<p>The VET Dux of Year Award is presented to the Year 12 VET student in the cohort who achieves the highest academic results overall in the VET Program.</p> <p><b>Criteria:</b></p> <p>The VET Dux of Year Award is presented to the student in the VET cohort only who achieves the highest academic results in the three General courses, and as assessed in the ADWPL program and accompany Certificate</p>
<b>ATAR Dux</b>	<p>The ATAR Dux of Year Award is presented to the Year 12 ATAR student in the cohort who achieves the highest academic results overall in the ATAR Program.</p> <p><b>Criteria:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minimum enrolment of 4 ATAR courses</li> <li>• Course bonus as applied for LOTE and Double Maths</li> </ul>
<b>Union Award</b>	Those students who preference to enrol in a teaching course
<b>Post School Academic Recommendation Awards</b>	<p>Curtin, ECU, Murdoch, Notre Dame, and UWA</p> <p>TAFEs</p> <p>n/a for 2017</p>

<b>Community Awards – student and / or teacher nominations required*</b>	
<b>Community Service Award</b>	<p><b>Criteria:</b> Student has demonstrated by his/her behaviour a generosity of spirit and positive attitude toward peers, staff and visitors. This could include-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• demonstrating compassion, respect, co-operation, courtesy, good grace, dignity and/or kindness</li> <li>• being prepared to be of service to others and willing to accept responsibility and volunteer appropriately</li> <li>• being a role model for other students</li> <li>• demonstrating the ability to organise and work in groups both effectively and harmoniously</li> <li>• demonstrating a commitment to the school community through participation in a range of activities including music, sport, community service, fund raising and college activities</li> </ul>
<b>Long Tan Leadership and Teamwork Award</b>	<p><b>Criteria:</b> Student has demonstrated leadership and influence of peers by example. This could include-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• contributing positively to the classroom, school and the community</li> <li>• assuming a leadership role and/or is selected to be in a leadership position in various school activities, extracurricular activities and in the community</li> <li>• contributing to problem solving in peaceful ways</li> <li>• demonstrating respect for diversity and the view of others</li> <li>• displaying an excellent attitude to education and school life</li> <li>• demonstrating a capacity for civics and is an outstanding citizen of the school</li> </ul>
<b>Sports Award</b>	<p><b>Criteria:</b> Student shows good sportsmanship, sporting skills and is a team player. This could include-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• demonstrating an ongoing commitment to and involvement in a range of college sporting activities;</li> <li>• demonstrating an exemplary attitude and conduct which supports college values</li> </ul>
<b>Endeavour Award (proudly sponsored by Caltex)</b>	<p><b>Criteria:</b> Student has demonstrated effort or improvement in his/her work habits and skills. This could include–</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• demonstrating effort</li> <li>• demonstrating enthusiasm, a positive attitude and an application to task</li> <li>• improvement in academic standard</li> </ul>

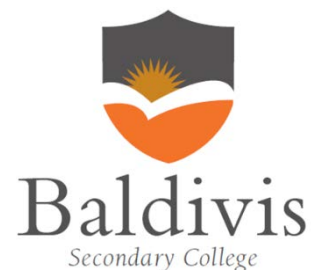

<b>Bushrangers Award</b>	<p>Student who has most contributed in the Bushrangers school program</p> <p><b>Criteria:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• demonstrated commitment/ leadership</li><li>• leadership within the school community towards bushranger projects with a focus on improving the college culture/ environment.</li><li>• leadership within the broader community in improving the opportunities for other young people.</li></ul>
<b>Arts Award</b>	<p><b>Criteria:</b></p> <p>Student shows good participation and interest in the Arts, demonstrates application of a range of skills and is a team player.</p> <p>This could include-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• demonstrating an ongoing commitment to and involvement in a range of college performance activities;</li><li>• demonstrating an exemplary attitude and conduct which supports college values</li><li>• the ability to demonstrate high levels of creativity and originality.</li></ul>

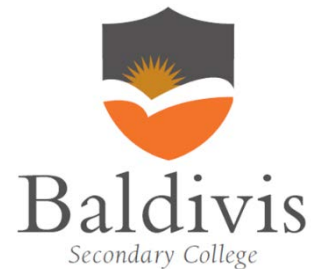

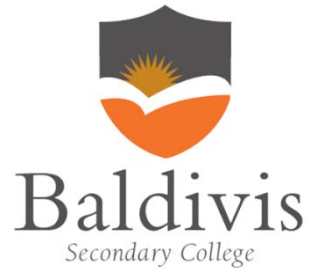
*The Course, Certificate, and Endorsed Program Awards are determined by the following criteria:*

- Achieves a minimum of a B grade for Unit 3 and 4, or, is in the top 15% of the state Course enrolments.

Certificate and Endorsed Program winners are presented to those Year 12 students who demonstrated competency in all units for that Certificate/Program, as well as who achieved the highest attributes as measured by the College's Senior School Good Standing Policy within that Certificate/Program, together with Course teacher recommendations based on industry best practice.

*If no student has achieved the criteria stated above, then no award will be offered in that year.*
