ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Baldivis Secondary College's Specialised Learning Program (SLP) for students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) supports the individual needs of students and aims to provide a greater opportunity for engagement. The Year 7 to Year 12 program provides education and support for the social and emotional development of students with ASD who have the potential to achieve academic success in mainstream schooling and beyond.

The Specialised Learning Program Autism (SLP-A) features specialised teacher and education assistant support, a space for study and organisation support, a private courtyard for safe and quiet breaks, Gus, the disability support sensory dog, a sensory room, the cube as a safe and supervised space at recess and lunchtime, a specialised exercise and wellness program.

Each student works towards achieving their goals in a caring and supportive environment which acknowledges their unique learning profile. The SLP-A is an evidence-based program reflective of current best practice research and is supported by the School of Special Education Needs.

Students attend Life Classes that focus on developing skills around self-regulation and social skills while working closely with their SLP-A teacher. The health curriculum is also delivered by the SLP-A teachers to ensure that important topics can be explored and fully understood.

The SLP-A has a dedicated facility within the mainstream environment where staff are able to run individually tailored education programs for students who have gaps in their learning. This provides students with extra learning opportunities.

Like all Baldivis Secondary College students, SLP-A students are allocated to a homeroom group depending upon their year level. Homeroom occurs between Periods 1 and 2 on Mondays, Tuesday, Wednesdays and Fridays.

STUDENT SELECTION

ELIGIBILITY

Students eligible for this program have demonstrated their ability to achieve grade levels necessary for success and integration into mainstream secondary school. They demonstrate the potential to access the academic opportunities to be successful in secondary school and beyond. These students may be at risk of underachieving or disengaging without this program due to barriers with communication and/or social skills limiting their full access to the wider curriculum.

An applicant will need to meet the following criteria:

- Diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder (reports from Pediatrician, Psychologist and Speech Pathologist) without an intellectual disability diagnosis
- 2. Academically capable of understanding and coping with grade level content and tasks
- Manages behaviour independently or through the use of predetermined prompts and strategies
- 4. Independently manages personal care requirements

PROCESS AND TIMELINE


Parents who are expressing interest in the Specialised Learning Program for Autism at Baldivis Secondary College will need to follow the timeline below and attach the appropriate documents:

- Expression of Interest closes Friday, 3 May 2024 (Term 2 -Week 3)
- Assessment of Expression of Interest Term 2 (Weeks 5-6)
- SLP staff observation of student in current school Term 2 (Weeks 6-10)
- Panel assessment finalised and parents notified in writing Friday, 16
 August 2024 (Term 3- Week 5)
- Orientation days in SLP in Term 4 To be advised
